TORONTO, ONTARIO

As Canada's Largest And Most Diverse City, Toronto Buzzes With Global Energy And Iconic Landmarks. TOP ATTRACTIONS IN CANADA



NIAGARA FALLS, ONTARIO

No List Of Canadian Attractions Is Complete Without The Thunderous Spectacle Of Niagara Falls. Straddling The Border Between Ontario And New York, The Canadian Side Offers The Most Impressive Views, With Three Massive Waterfalls—Horseshoe, American, And Bridal Veil—Plunging Into The Niagara River Below.



You Can Take A Boat Ride With Niagara City Cruises Right To The Base Of The Falls, Walk Behind The Cascades Via The Journey Behind The Falls, Or Admire The Illumination At Night When The Water Glows In A Kaleidoscope Of Colours. The Surrounding Area Also Features Wineries, The Niagara SkyWheel, And The Historic Town Of Niagara-On-The-Lake.



BANFF NATIONAL PARK, ALBERTA

Nestled In The Heart Of The Canadian Rockies, Banff National Park Is A UNESCO World Heritage Site And A Natural Wonderland Of Towering Peaks, Turquoise Lakes, And Abundant Wildlife. Lake Louise, With Its Glacial Waters And Iconic Fairmont Chateau, Is Perhaps The Park's Most Famous Gem, While Moraine Lake Stuns With Its Vivid Blue Hues And Mountain Backdrop. Visitors Can Hike Scenic Trails, Relax In The Banff Upper Hot Springs, Or Take The Banff Gondola To The Summit Of Sulphur Mountain For Panoramic Views. Banff Is Canada's Crown Jewel For Alpine Adventure And Breathtaking Landscapes.

CN TOWER, TORONTO

For Thrill-Seekers, EdgeWalk Is A Bucket-List Adventure Where You're Harnessed In And Walk Hands-Free Along The Tower's Outer Ledge. Day Or Night, The CN Tower Delivers Unforgettable Cityscapes And Heart-Pounding Excitement.



OLD QUEBEC (VIEUX-QUÉBEC), QUEBEC CITY

Step Into Living History In Old Quebec, A UNESCO World Heritage Site That's Unlike Anywhere Else In North America. Encircled By Fortified Walls, The Cobble Streets, 17th-Century Buildings, And Charming Squares Evoke A Bygone European Era. The Majestic Château Frontenac Presides Over The City, While The Terrasse Dufferin Offers Stunning Views Of The St. Lawrence River. WHISTLER BLACKCOMB, BRITISH COLUMBIA

As One Of North America's Premier Mountain Resorts, Whistler Blackcomb Is A Year-Round Destination That Dazzles Skiers, Snowboarders, Hikers, And Mountain Bikers Alike. The Museum's Design Leads Visitors On A Journey From Darkness To Light, Culminating In The Tower Of Hope, Which Offers Sweeping Views Of The City. It's A Place For Reflection, Education, And Inspiration—An Essential Visit For Travellers Seeking Meaning And Impact.



HOPEWELL ROCKS, NEW BRUNSWICK

The Hopewell Rocks, Also Known As The Flowerpot Rocks, Are A Geological Wonder Located In The Bay Of Fundy—Home To The Highest Tides In The World. These Towering Rock Formations Have Been Sculpted By Tidal Erosion Over Thousands Of Years And Stand Dramatically On The Ocean Floor. Visitors Can Walk Among The Rocks At Low Tide And Kayak Around Them At High Tide, Experiencing One Of Earth's Most Dramatic Tidal Shifts. Interpretive Trails, Viewing Platforms, And A Visitor Centre Help Tell The Story Of This Incredible Natural Phenomenon Found Nowhere Else On The Planet.
