## EXUMA CAYS LAND AND SEA PARK

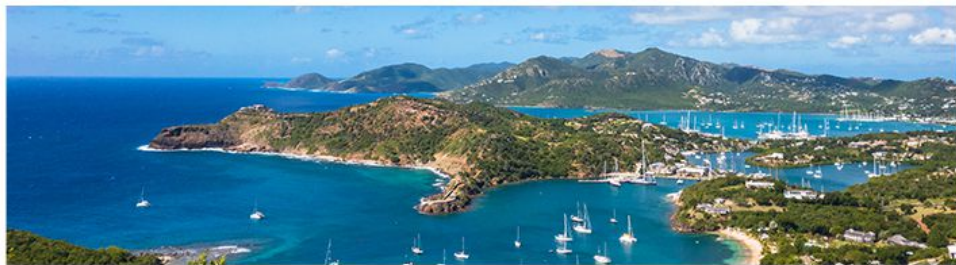
## THE PITONS

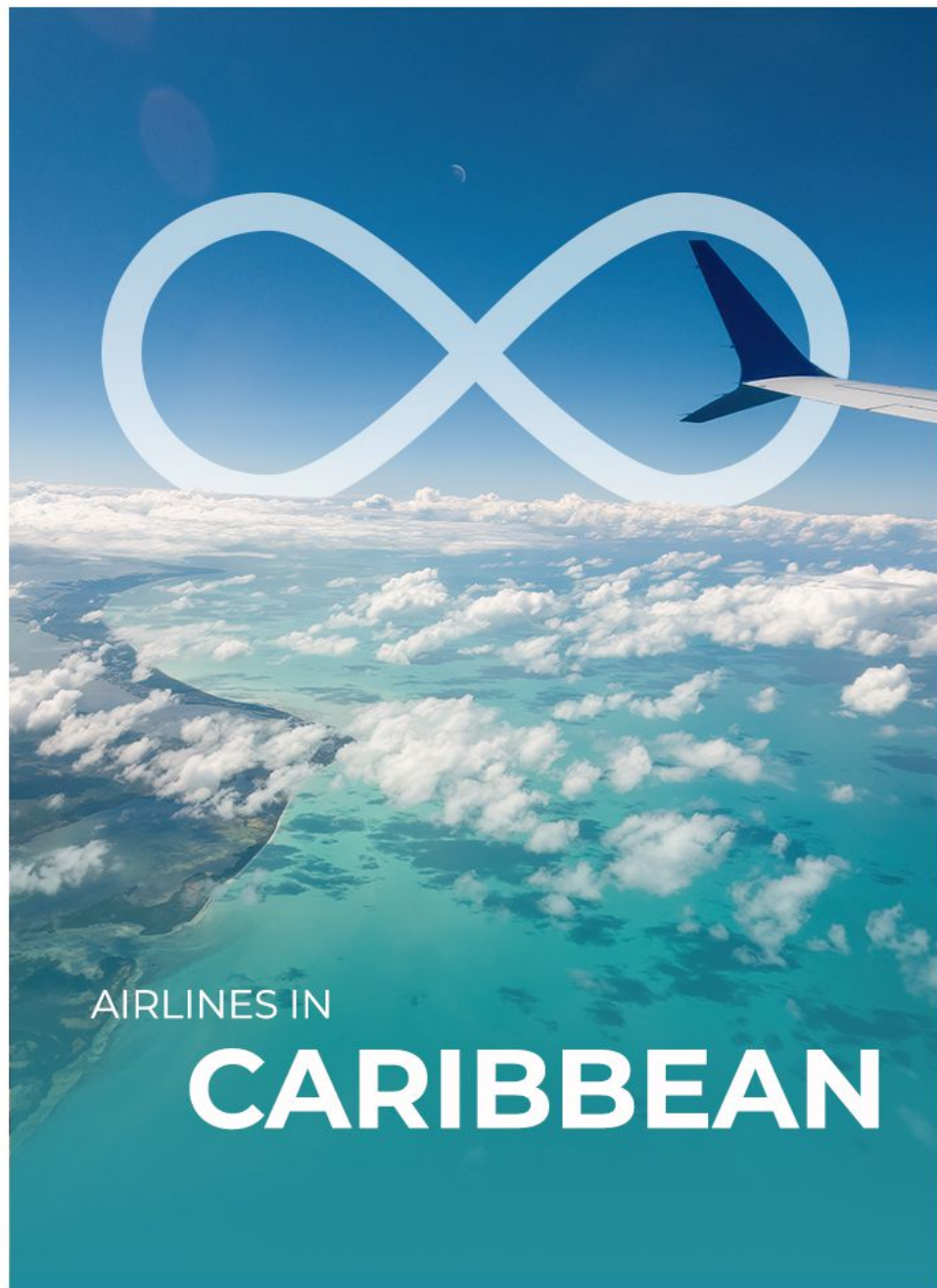


## EXPLORE NATURAL BRIDGE RUINS, ARUBA
