


DUBLIN

SWIM ALONG THE ATLANTIC WAY

VISIT A JAIL IN DUBLIN

In Dublin's Kilmainham Gaol, History Comes To Life Through The Telling Of Some Of The Most Heartbreaking Stories Of Ireland's Fight For Independence Against British Colonial Rule. Famous Irish Revolutionary Countess Markievicz And The Leaders Of The 1916 Easter Rising – When Irish Nationalists Rose Up Against Britain – Were All Held At Kilmainham.

While Markievicz Escaped Her Death Sentence, 14 Leaders Of The Rising Were Executed By Firing Squad In The Stonebreakers' Yard. As You Head To This Jail In Dublin, Remember The Yard Is The Last Stop On A Poignant Tour, Which Must Be Pre-Booked In Advance.





HOP ON A ROMANTIC TOUR TO AN IRISH CASTLE

HIKE THROUGH THE MOURNE MOUNTAINS

The Vast Wilderness Of The Mourne Mountains In County Down Was The Inspiration For C.S. Lewis In His Narnia Series.
