LISBON

SINTRA

THE MINHO

1. PENA PALACE – SINTRA

Perched High In The Sintra Mountains, Pena Palace Is Portugal's One Of The Most Enchanting Landmarks, A Riot Of Color, Towers, And Turrets That Looks Straight Out Of A Fairytale. This 19th-Century Romantic Palace Blends Gothic, Moorish, And Manueline Influences, And Its Dramatic Hilltop Setting Offers Breathtaking Views Over Forests, Valleys, And Even The Atlantic Ocean On A Clear Day. Surrounded By The Lush Parque Da Pena, It's The Crown Jewel Of Sintra And A Must-See For Architecture And History Lovers Alike.



3. DOURO VALLEY – NORTHERN PORTUGAL

The Douro Valley Is One Of The Most Scenic Wine Regions In The World, Where Rolling Hills Are Terraced With Centuries-Old Vineyards Overlooking The Winding Douro River. Designed By A Student Of Gustave Eiffel, It Connects The Historic Centre Of Porto With Vila Nova De Gaia, Where The Famous Port Wine Cellars Are Located. Below The Bridge Lies Ribeira, Porto's Colourful And Lively Riverside District Filled With Cafés, Street Music, And Stunning Sunset Views. Whether You're Walking Across The Upper Deck Or Enjoying A Drink Along The River, This Area Captures The Spirit Of The City.

6. UNIVERSITY OF COIMBRA & JOANINA LIBRARY – COIMBRA

Founded In The 13th Century, The University Of Coimbra Is A Symbol Of Portugal's Academic And Cultural Heritage. At Its Heart Lies The Joanina Library, A Baroque Gem Filled With Gilded Woodwork, Frescoed Ceilings, And Shelves Of Ancient Books. The Campus Itself Sits Atop A Hill Overlooking The City And Includes Historic Halls, Courtyards, And Ceremonial Traditions. Visiting Coimbra Gives A Glimpse Into Portugal's Intellectual Soul, Where The Past Still Shapes The Rhythm Of Student Life.

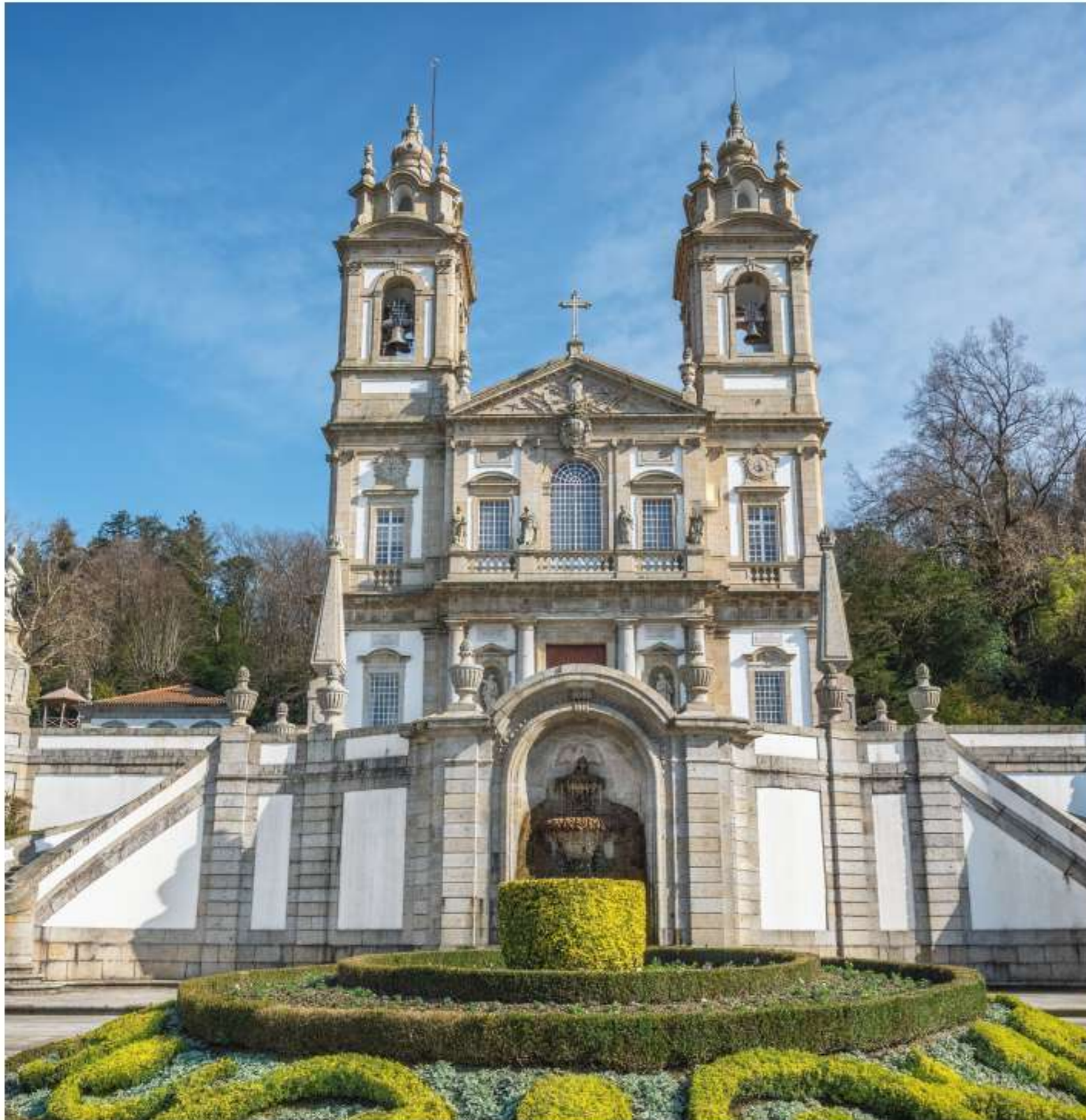


7. SÃO JORGE CASTLE – LISBON

1. CATCH SUNSET AT PORTAS DO SOL (LISBON)
