LISBON

BELEM TOWER (LISBON)

A Symbol Of Portugal's Age Of Discovery, Belém Tower Is A UNESCO-Listed Fortress Standing On The Banks Of The Tagus River. Built-In The 16th Century, This Manueline-Style Monument Served As A Defense System And A Gateway To Lisbon. Its Intricate Stone Carvings And Maritime Motifs Make It One Of The City's Most Photographed Landmarks.

Visitors Can Explore The Tower's Narrow Staircases And Terraces, Which Provide Stunning Views Over The River. Nearby, The Jerónimos Monastery And The Famous Pastéis De Belém Bakery Complete A Perfect Cultural And Culinary Experience.



PENA PALACE (SINTRA)




OBIDOS


HIKE THE LEVADA TRAILS IN MADEIRA
