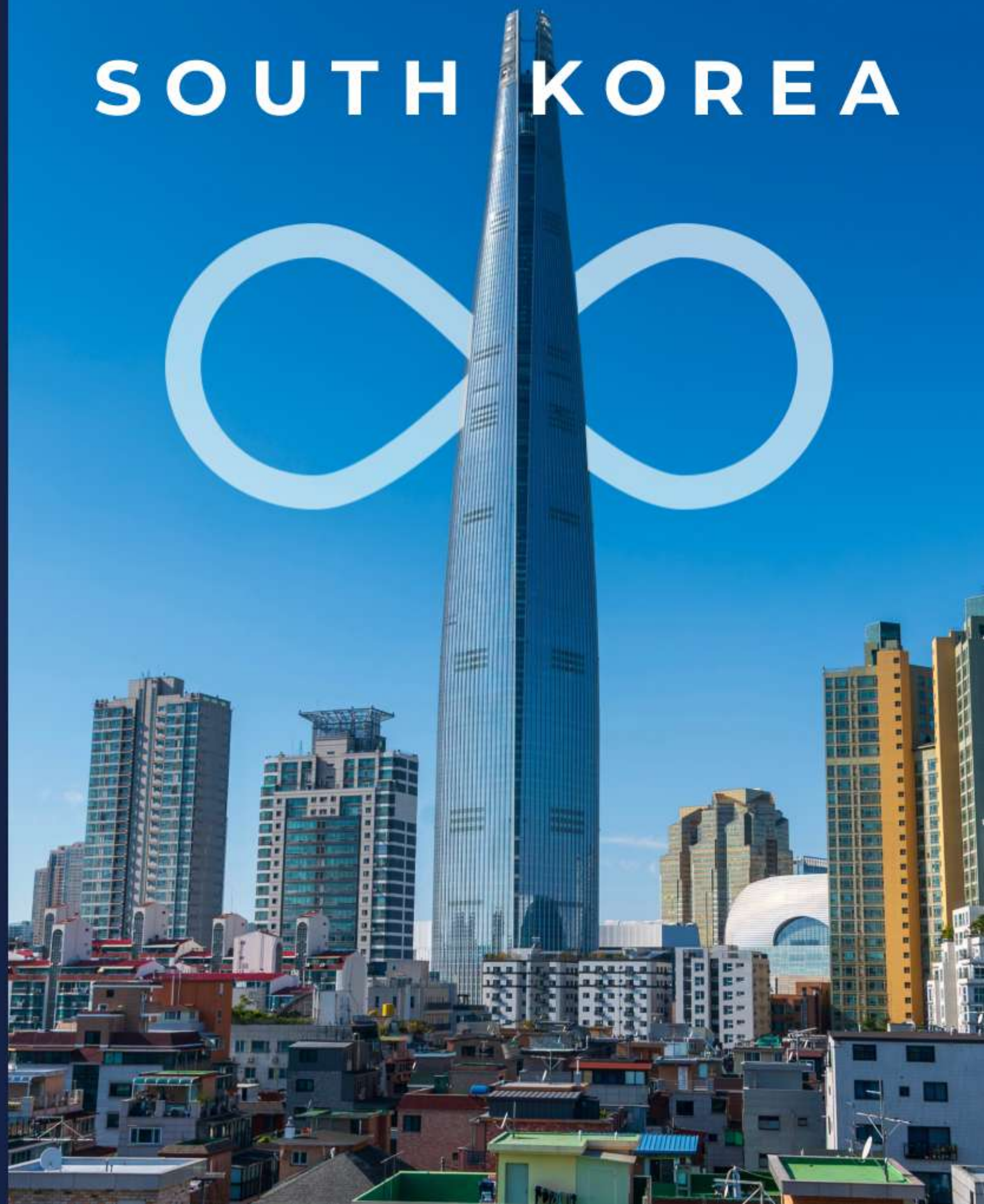

SEOUL

South Korea's Dazzling Capital Is A City Where Ancient Palaces And Modern Skyscrapers Coexist Harmoniously. Don't Miss A Hike Up Namsan Mountain For Sweeping City Views Or A Stroll Along The Scenic Cheonggyecheon Stream.



BUSAN

Relax On The Sands Of Haeundae Beach Or Gwangalli Beach, And Explore The Colorful Gamcheon Culture Village. The City's Food Scene Is A Delight, And Its Rich Artistic Heritage Shines Through Calligraphy Shops, Museums, And Vibrant Festivals.



DAEGU

Set Against The Backdrop Of Scenic Mountains, Daegu Is A Modern City With Deep Cultural Roots. Visit The Donghwas Temple, Shop For Korean Herbal Medicine At The Yangnyeongsi Market, And Experience The Excitement Of Daegu's Music And Fashion Districts. Spring Visitors Will Be Enchanted By The City's Colorful Cherry Blossom Road.



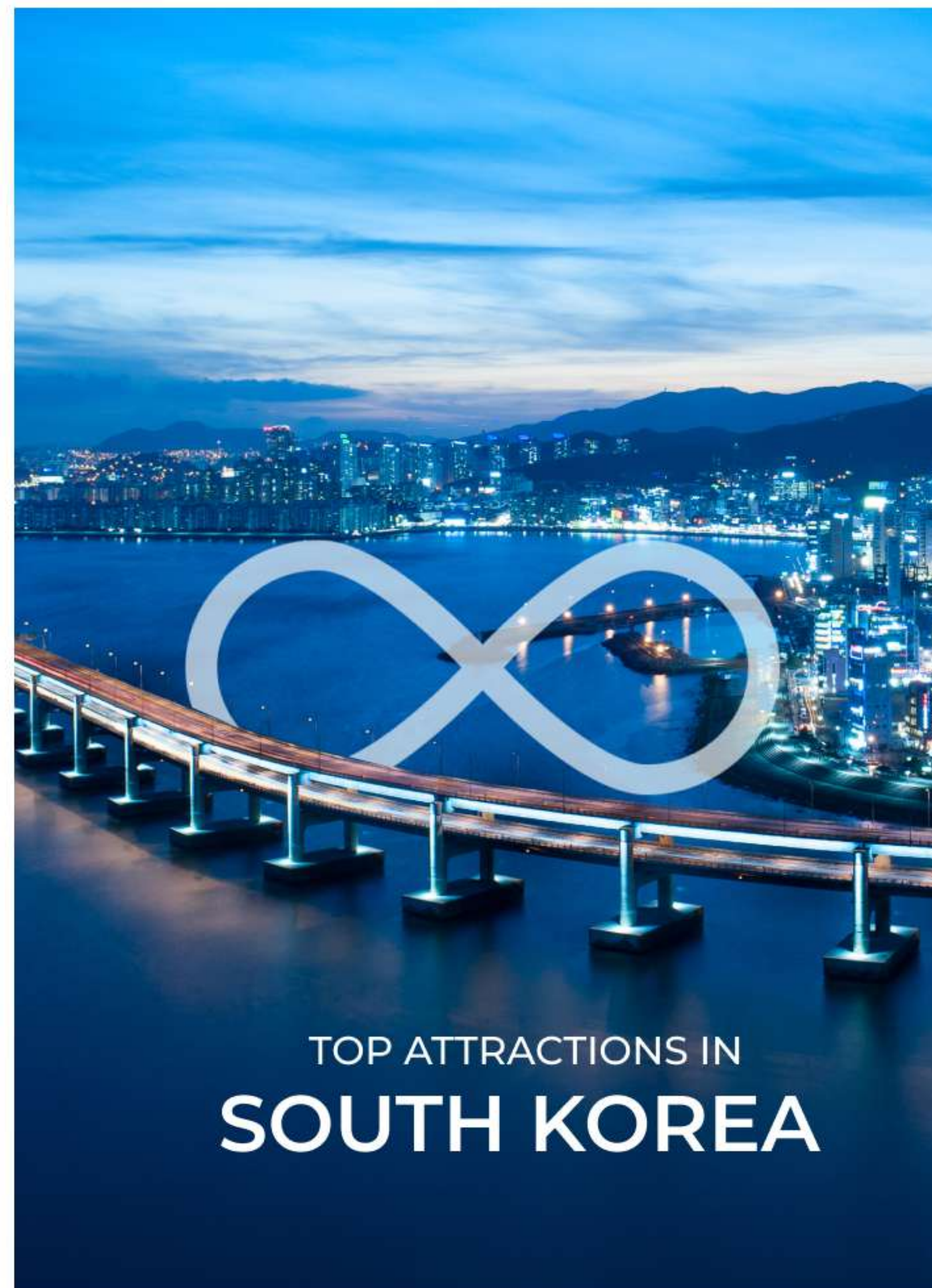
SUWON

TOP ATTRACTIONS IN
SOUTH KOREA

GYEONGBOKGUNG PALACE (SEOUL)

Gyeongbokgung Palace Is The Grandest Of Seoul's Historic Palaces, Originally Built In 1395 During The Joseon Dynasty. Visitors Can Wander Through Its Imposing Gates, Tranquil Courtyards, And Elegant Pavilions, All Set Against The Backdrop Of Mount Bugaksan. The Changing Of The Royal Guard Ceremony, Held Daily At The Main Gate, Offers A Colorful Glimpse Into Korea's Regal Traditions. The Palace Complex Also Houses The National Folk Museum, Where You Can Delve Deeper Into The Country's Rich Cultural Heritage.



N SEOUL TOWER (SEOUL)

Rising 236 Meters Atop Namsan Mountain, N Seoul Tower Provides Breathtaking Panoramic Views Of The Sprawling Capital. A Favorite Spot For Couples, It's Famed For The "Locks Of Love" That Adorn Its Fences. Visitors Can Take A Scenic Cable Car Ride Or Hike Up Through Namsan Park Before Enjoying The Observation Decks, Restaurants, And Digital Exhibits. At Night, The Tower Is Beautifully Illuminated, Creating A Striking Symbol On Seoul's Skyline.



HAEUNDAE BEACH (BUSAN)

Haeundae Beach Is One Of South Korea's Most Beloved Seaside Escapes, Drawing Both Locals And International Visitors. Its Wide Stretch Of Golden Sand Is Perfect For Sunbathing, Beach Sports, And Water Activities, While The Nearby Boardwalk Teems With Cafés, Bars, And Street Food Stalls. Haeundae Comes Alive In Summer With Lively Festivals, Sand Sculpture Competitions, And Dazzling Fireworks Displays, Making It A Vibrant Destination Day And Night.



HWASEONG FORTRESS (SUWON)

A UNESCO World Heritage Site, Hwaseong Fortress Showcases The Military Ingenuity Of The Late 18th Century. Encircling Suwon's Historic Center, The Fortress Walls Stretch Over 5 Kilometers, Punctuated By Imposing Gates, Watchtowers, And Artillery Bastions. Visitors Can Walk Along The Ramparts, Enjoy Scenic Views Of The City, Or Try Their Hand At Traditional Archery Inside The Fortress Grounds. The Illuminated Walls At Dusk Provide A Magical Sight.



BULGUKSA TEMPLE & SEOKGURAM GROTTO (GYEONGJU)

Set Amidst Forested Hills, Bulguksa Temple And Seokguram Grotto Are Jewels Of Buddhist Art And Architecture. Bulguksa's Graceful Pagodas, Stone Bridges, And Temple Halls Reflect The Spiritual And Artistic Heights Of The Silla Kingdom. A Short Hike Or Drive Up The Mountain Leads To Seokguram Grotto, Home To A Serene Stone Buddha Gazing Out Over The East Sea — A Masterpiece Of Harmony And Serenity Recognized By UNESCO.



JEJU VOLCANIC ISLAND & LAVA TUBES (JEJU)

Jeju Island's Unique Volcanic Landscape Offers Endless Adventure And Natural Beauty. Hike Up Hallasan Mountain, Korea's Highest Peak, Or Catch A Spectacular Sunrise At Seongsan Ilchulbong Crater. Beneath The Island, The Manjanggul Lava Tube Reveals A Surreal Underground World Formed By Ancient Volcanic Activity. The Island's Combination Of Beaches, Waterfalls, And Lush Countryside Makes It A Haven For Nature Lovers.
